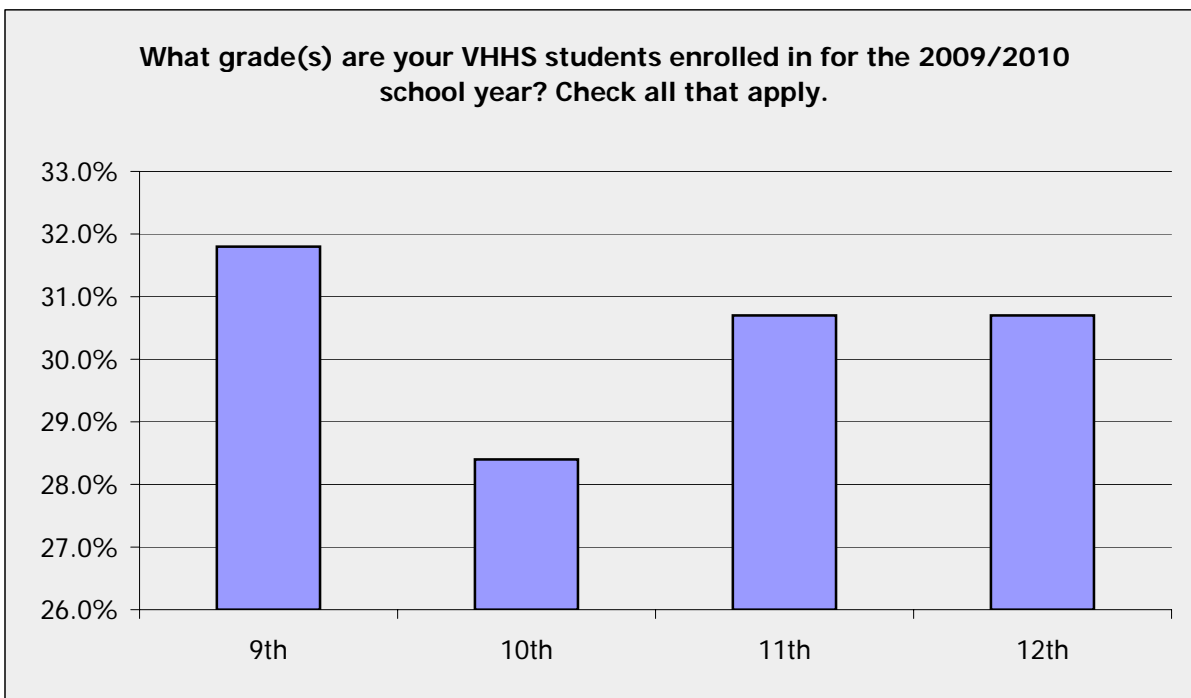

What grade(s) are your VHHS students enrolled in for the 2009/2010 school year? Check all that apply.

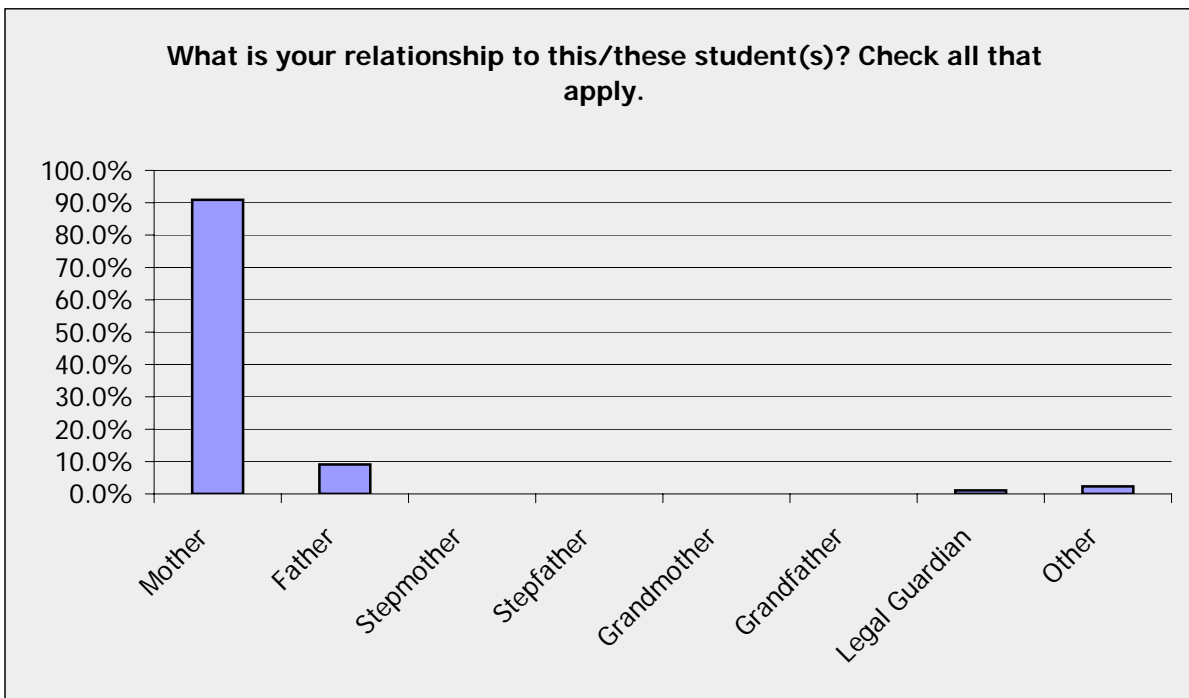

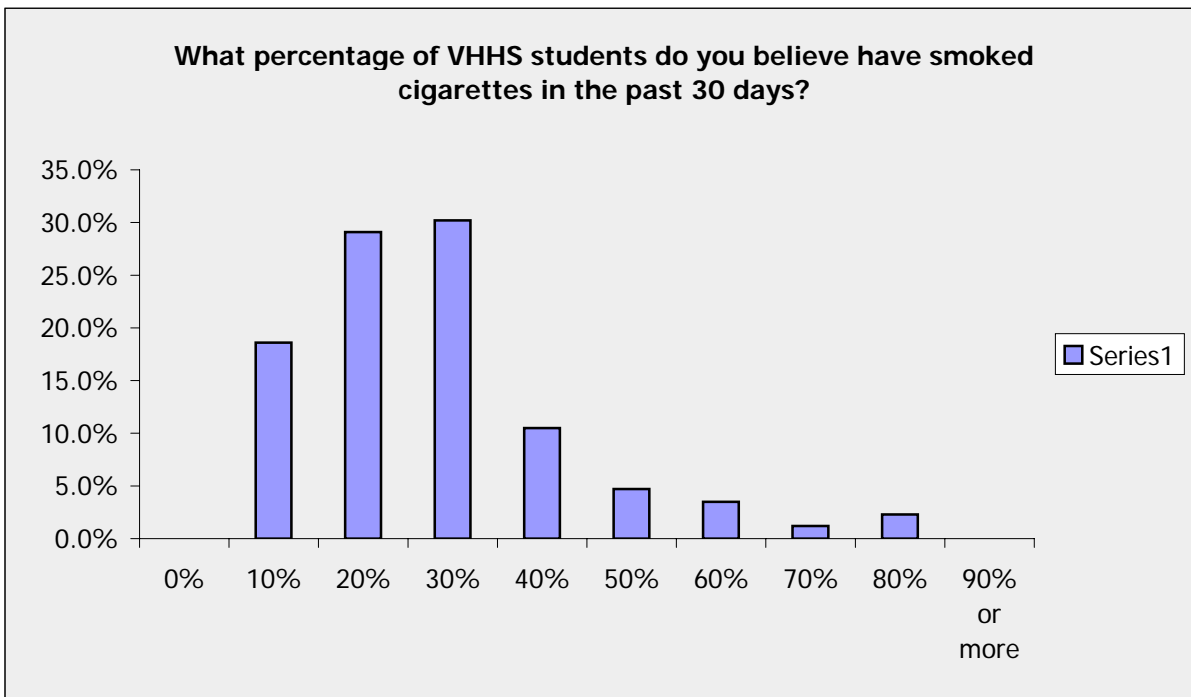

What percentage of VHHS students do you believe have smoked cigarettes in the past 30 days?

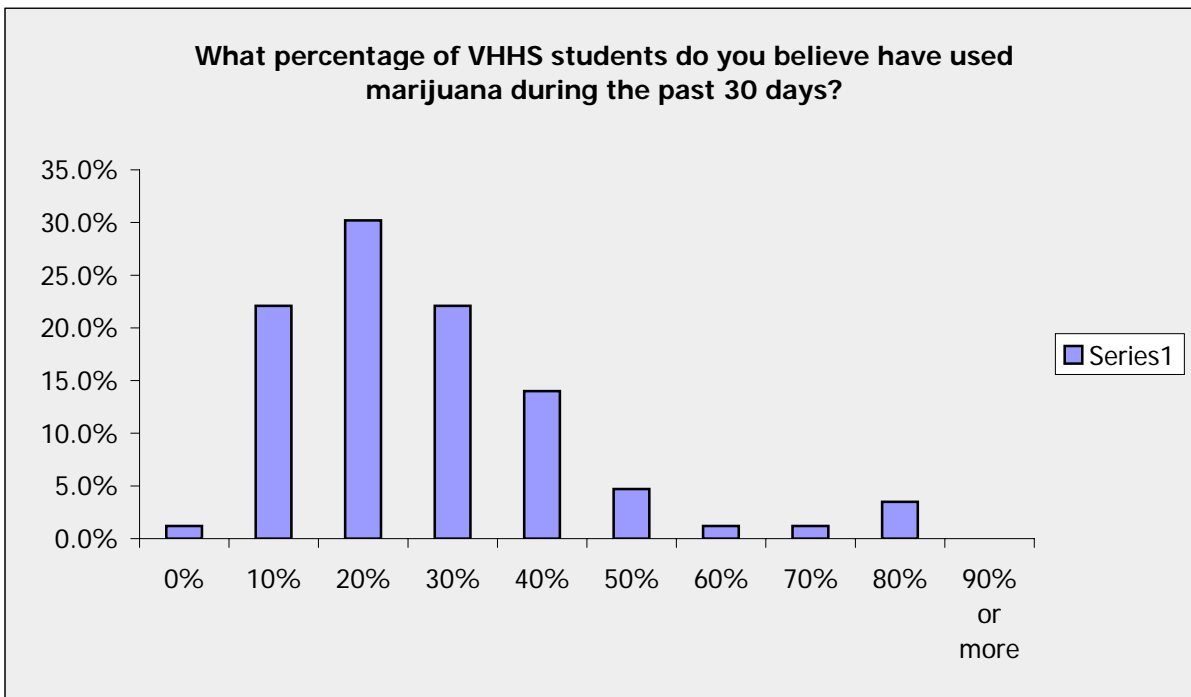

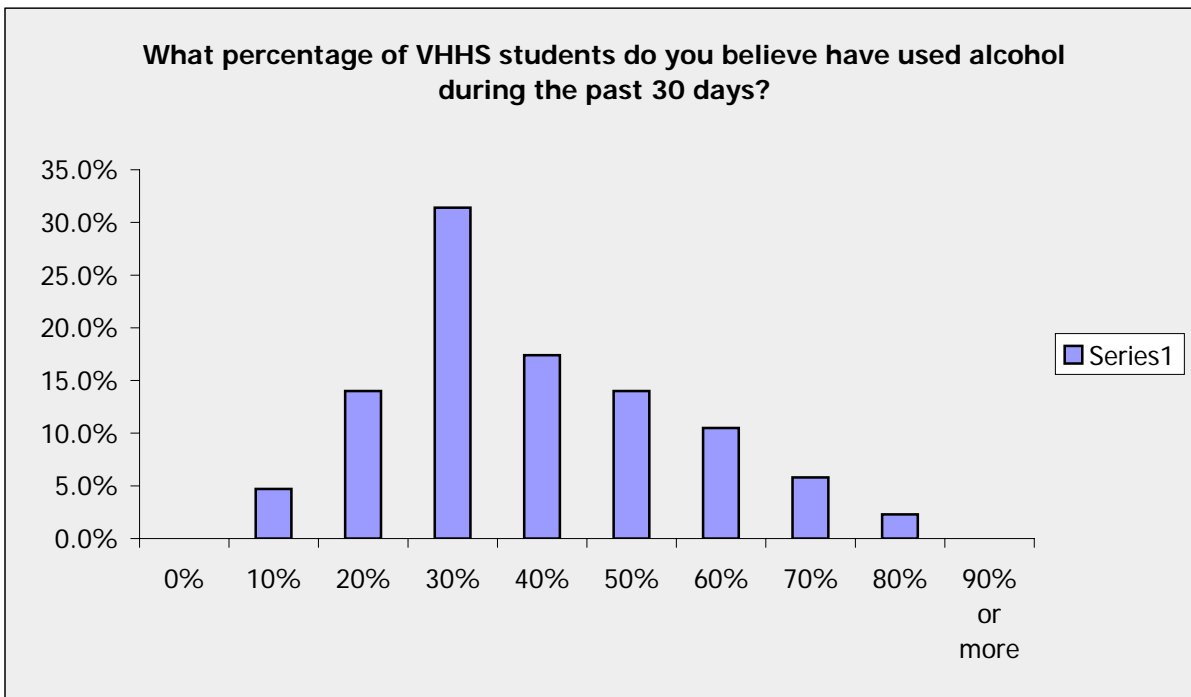

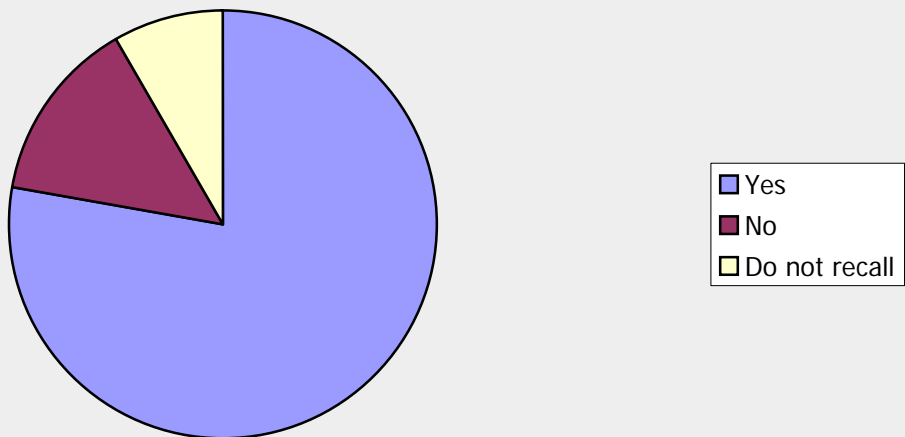

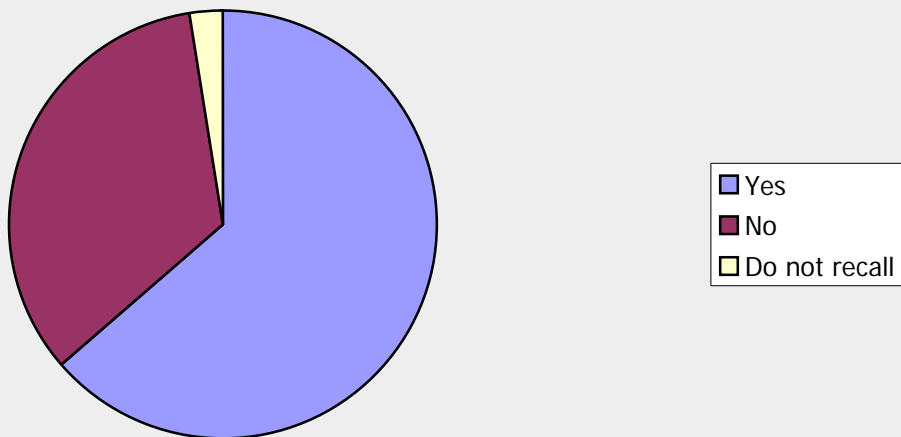

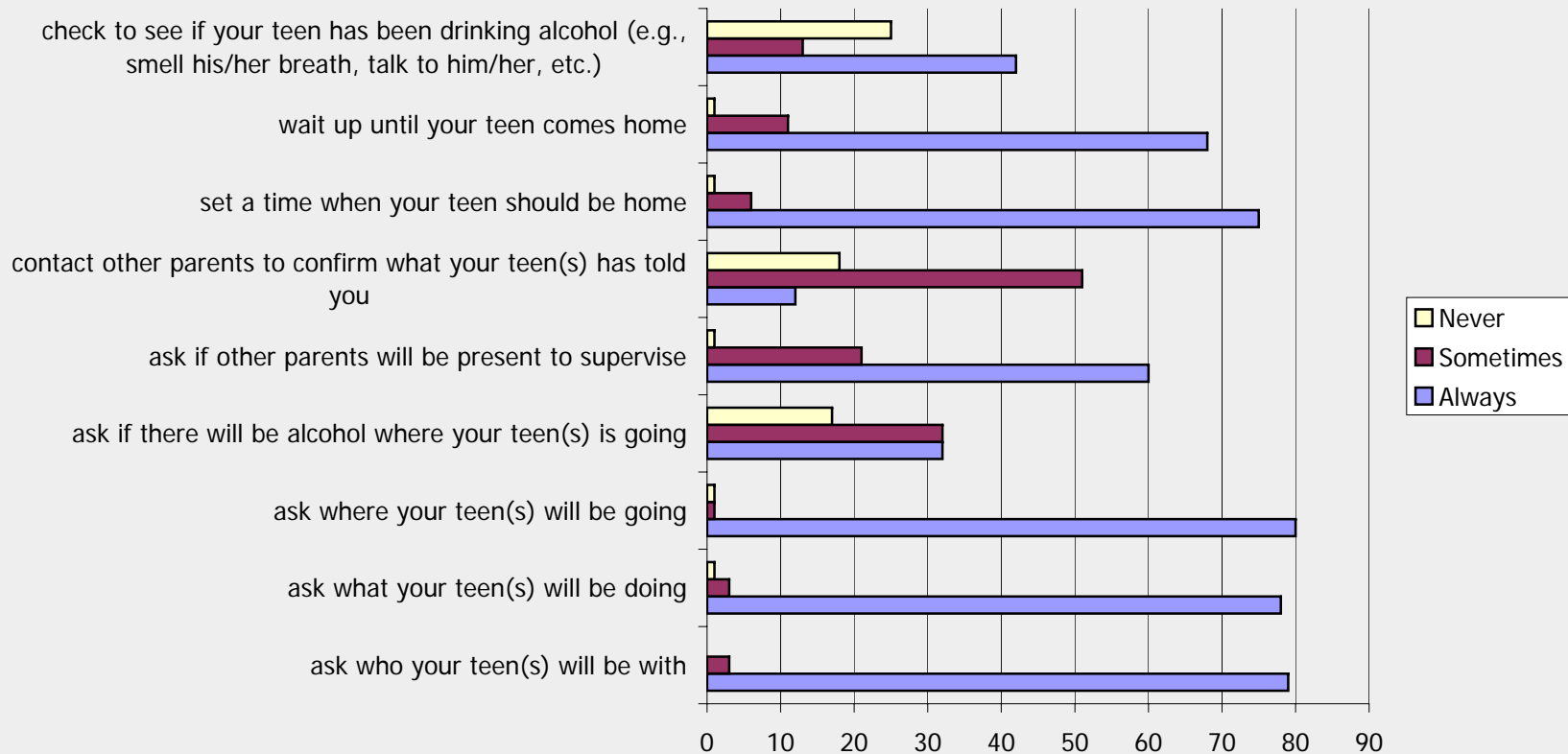

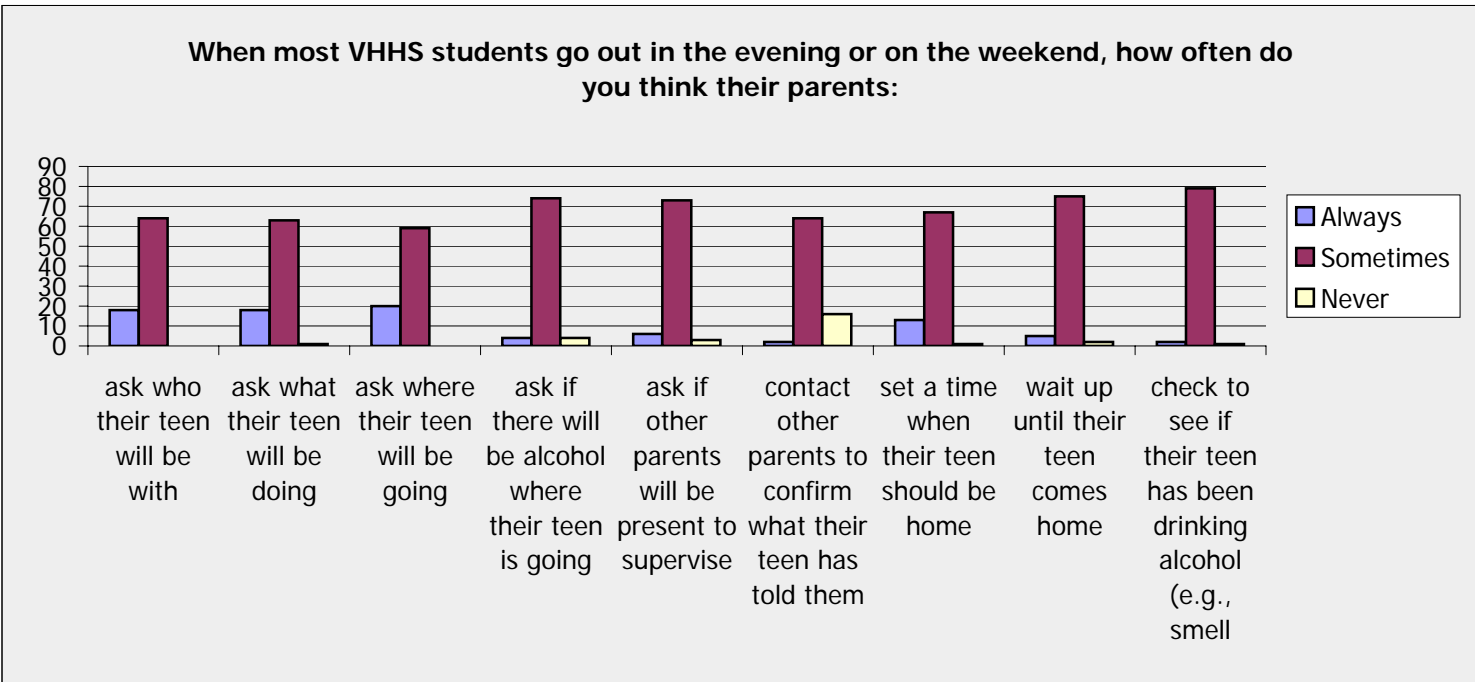

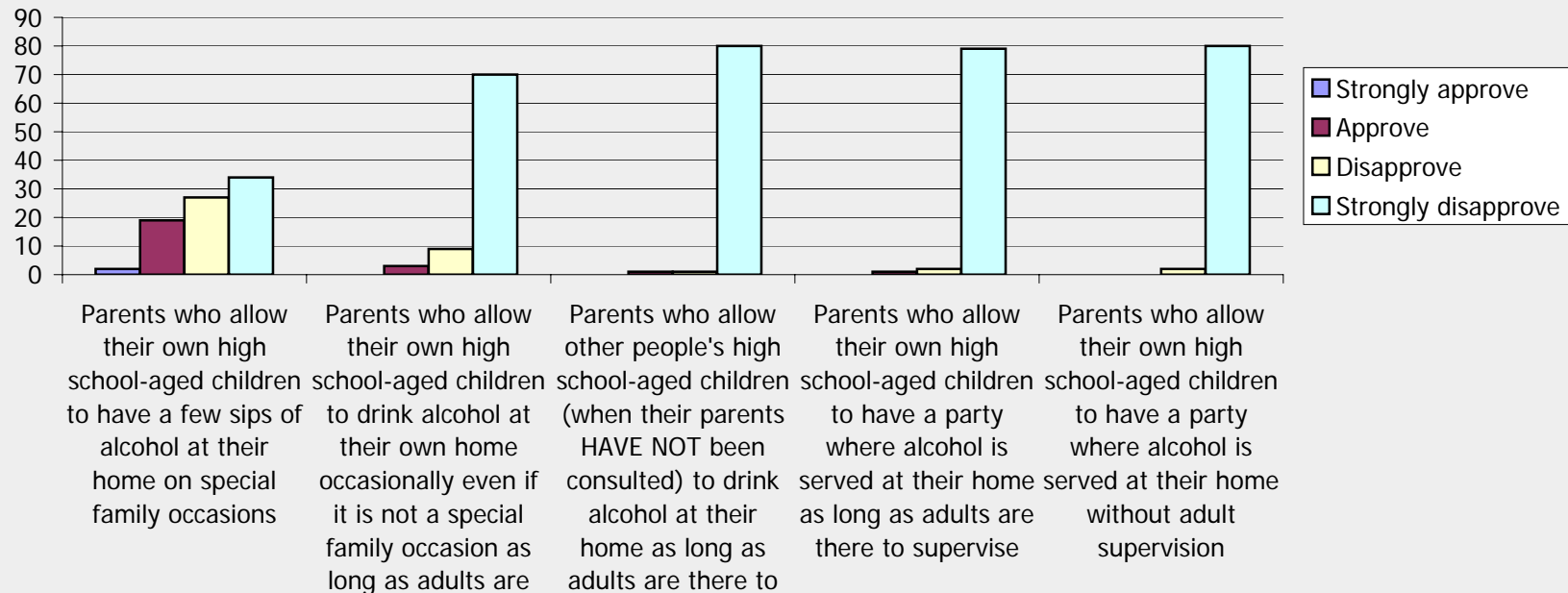

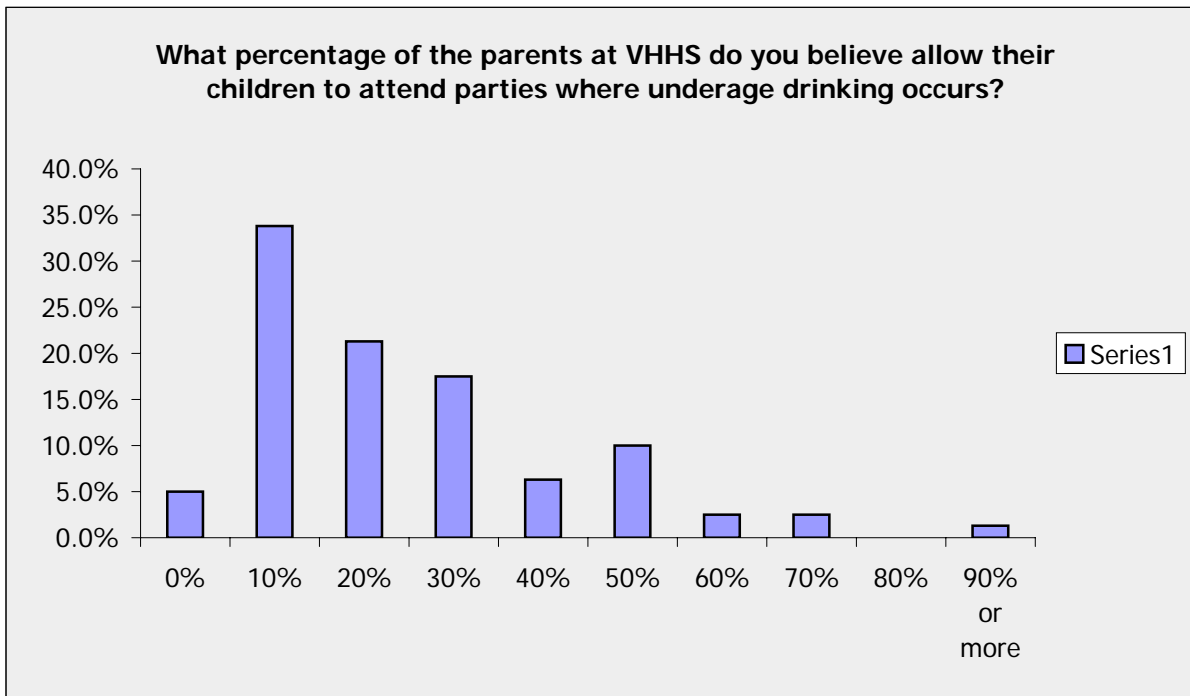
How much do you approve or disapprove of each of the following:

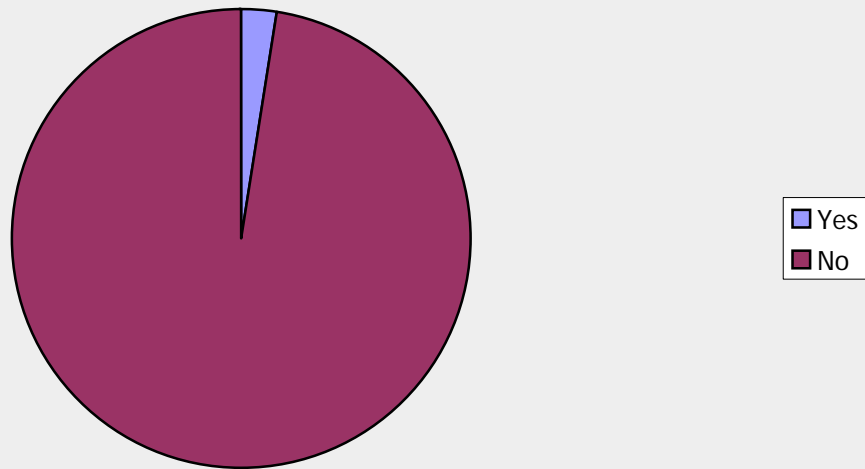

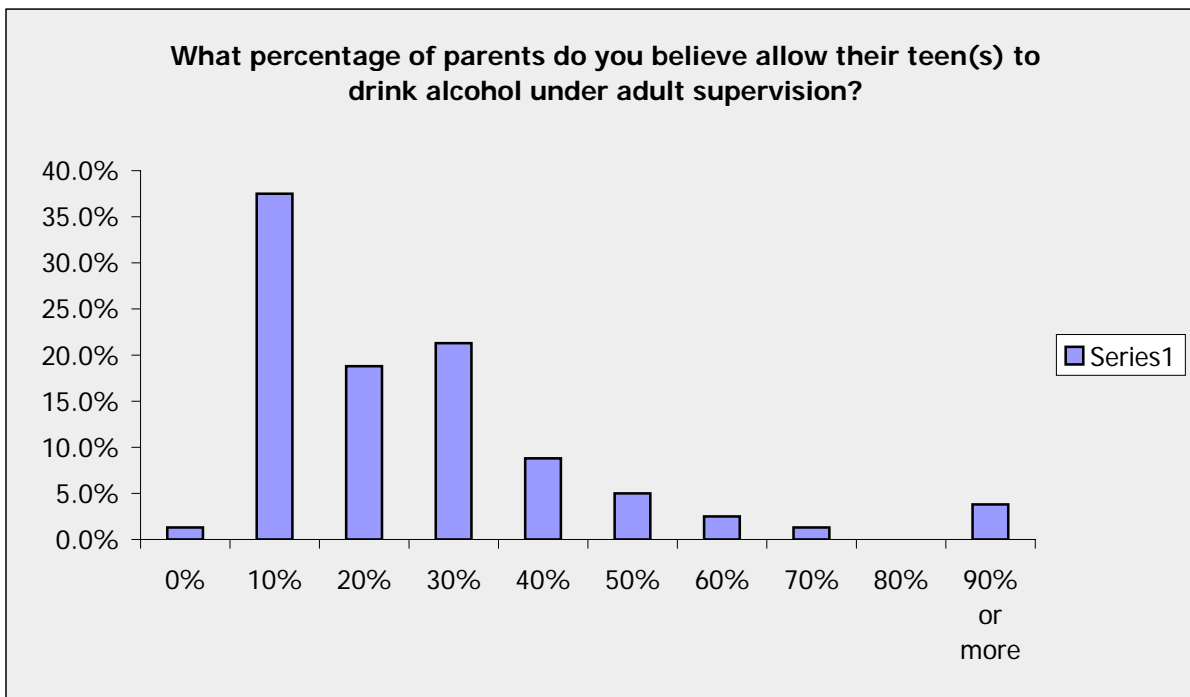
Do you allow your teen(s) to attend parties where underage drinking occurs?

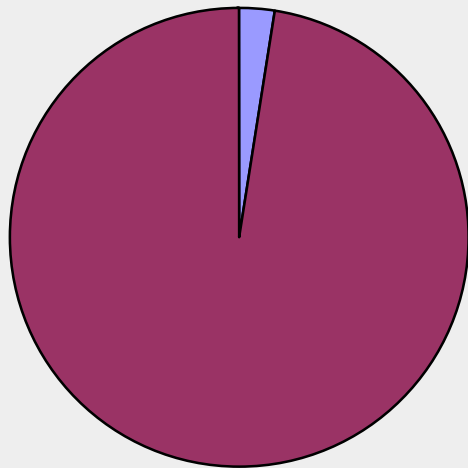
